### **THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD**

#### **First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6**

Jerusalem is extolled as a place of glory and splendor because the Lord has come to His own city.

#### **Second Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6**

Paul tells the Ephesians that his special mission is to make the Gentiles co-heirs with the Jews in Christ – “members of the same body and sharers of the promise.”

#### **Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12**

Herod learns that Wise Men from the East are searching for the newly born Christ Child. He instructs them to find the Child and to report His whereabouts to him. The Wise Men follow a star to the place where Mary and Jesus are and offer the Child gold, frankincense, and myrrh. They do not return to Herod but follow another route to their own country.
