PENTECOST SUNDAY

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

The disciples were celebrating Pentecost together when "tongues of fire appeared which parted, then came to rest on each of them." The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in foreign tongues. Visitors from many different countries were amazed that each guest could hear his or her native language being spoken as the disciples proclaimed God's glory.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

Each person has received different manifestations of the same spirit to contribute to the common good of all. All members of the Church have been baptized into one body because of our belief in the Holy Spirit, who was sent to us by God.

Gospel: 20:19-23

Jesus appeared to the disciples even though they had locked the doors in fear. Jesus then showed the disciples his hands and his side; and they rejoiced at his presence. He breathed on them saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit." He then gave the disciples the power for forgive others or hold them accountable for their sins.



PENTECOST 2016

Today is the great Feast of Pentecost. It recalls the Descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. This is the birth of the Church to which we belong. **The color of Pentecost is Red**, symbolizing the **Fire of the Holy Spirit** which set the **Apostles on Fire** and sent them out energized to proclaim that Jesus Christ has risen and the promised Advocate has come.

CARDINAL'S APPEAL

You may have or will receive shortly a **follow-up letter** from Cardinal Dolan regarding the **STATUS of the Appeal** in our parish. As of May 6th, 132 gifts have been made, totaling \$70,380. Our goal has been set at \$106,000. Last year we had 148 donors at around this time. We met our goal and the parish received a substantial rebate. This year we hoped to increase the number of donors to around 220. Therefore I am asking parishioners who have not responded yet to make their pledge or donation.

RICE BOWL THANKS YOU

Thanks to the generosity of St. Theresa parishioners, Operation Rice Bowl was a big success. Not only was \$1,600 raised for Catholic Relief Services projects, but participants came away with a greater appreciation of Catholic social justice issues around the world. Many thanks to all who participated, especially Clair Hammonds who has coordinated this drive for the past few Lent.
