TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 66:18-21

Isaiah portrays a time when people from many nations will gather in Jerusalem and proclaim God's glory. God's messengers will teach many nations about God. Just as the Israelites bring offerings, these messengers will bring people from all nations to worship.

Second Reading: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

The Hebrews are told that God disciplines those he loves. When a parent disciplines a child, the child usually learns what is expected of him. The Hebrews are encouraged to face life's trials as a form of discipline, and attempt to learn something from them.

Gospel: Luke 13:22-30

Jesus warns that the door to God's kingdom will be locked for those who ignored his wishes. Many people will come from all nations and take their place in God's kingdom. Others will not be recognized by God, and he will reject them.



FALL BIBLE STUDY

God is calling you to a deeper relationship with Him.

If we consider that God is the Divine Bridegroom and the Church is his Bride, then the prophets can be seen as "spiritual marriage counselors." They afflict the comfortable and comfort the afflicted. They call us to return to our covenant relationship with God. This fall our parish Bible Study will examine the Prophets, including Isaiah, Jeremiah, Hosea and others. We will begin on Thursday, September 8 at 7 p.m. in the lower church at St. Theresa's and continue for 10 consecutive weeks. The program includes video presentations, guided discussions, and optional home study. Come as often as your schedule permits, no prior bible study or experience necessary. The program is FREE. In addition to the tasks at hand, this ministry gathers for a social breakfast twice a year and is always invited but never pressured to pray the Rosary after 9:00 Mass Monday through Saturday.

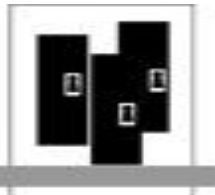
